Opportunities for multi-levelling

Many courses can be multi-levelled. Multi-levelling requires careful planning of learning pathways for individuals and groups of students involving:

- the selection of appropriate standards
- careful choice of topics ones that can be achieved at a number of different levels
- the provision of student assessment material that makes specific reference to the performance criteria of the different standards used
- the re-writing or provision of different assessment materials e.g. reading texts may need to be simplified or sourced from more complex texts that are on the same topic.

Below are some possible standards that can be multi-levelled. Please note the following:

- This list provides some possible opportunities for multi-levelling.
- It is not an exhaustive list of unit standards or opportunities for multi-levelling.
- It is NOT suggested that teachers attempt to offer, and indeed it would be unwise to offer, assessments across the five levels indicated in one class. A suggested maximum number of levels would be three for example ESOL unit standards levels 1, 2 and 3 or ESOL unit standards level 3 and English standards levels 1 and 2.
- This chart does not indicate a hierarchy or equivalency between ESOL and English unit standards. This is a discussion for a future debate by the sector.

Note that the level 4 ESOL unit standards are yet to be registered.
