Nouns:

- Proper nouns e.g. Autumn
- Common nouns e.g. leaves, ground, sadness

Prepositions:

- Of place along, on, over etc., e.g. along the ground

Articles:

- Definite the, e.g. the wind
- Omission of articles
- before most proper nouns,
- with uncountable nouns e.g. in Autumn

Pronouns:

- Subject I, you, we, they etc., e.g. You are down.
- Possessive our, her, my, their etc., e.g. crunching under my feet

Conjunctions and connectives:

- Additive and, also, as well etc., e.g. You are down and alone.

Question formation:

- 'wh' e.g. Why is the poem sad? What is the poem about?
- Subject reversal e.g. Is it winter?
- 'do' support
- when no auxiliary e.g. Do the leaves move along the ground?
- Modal 'can' e.g. Can you imagine the trees.

Short answer forms:

- e.g. Yes, she does. No, she doesn't. Yes, it has. No, it hasn't.
- Yes, it is. No, it isn't.
