When you put paper over a leaf and rub it with crayon, all the details of the leaf will show up on the paper.


You can use leaf rubbings to create beautiful pictures.





Place the leaves on a hard, flat surface with their undersides up. Think about how you are going to set them out. You could make a picture using a number of leaves, or you could make a picture of each leaf by itself.
